An Ordinance Providing For The Issuance And Sale Of Bonds In The Maximum Principal Amount Of \$2,500,000 For The Purpose Of Paying The Costs Of Improving The City’s Parks And Recreational Facilities Including Ted Lewis Park To Include Among Other Things Designing And Installing Concessions, Playground Equipment, Amphitheater Seating, Plaza And Garden, Restrooms, Splash Pad, Mechanical Building And Storage, Improving Ball Fields, Shelters, Constructing Certain Roadway Improvements Including Excavating, Grading, Paving, Curbing, And Installing Sidewalks And Walkways, Any Related Public Utility Improvements, Landscaping, Pole Removal, Street Lighting And Signage, And Improving The Site Therefor, Together With All Driveways, Roads, Parking Facilities, And Other Necessary Appurtenances Thereto, And Declaring An Emergency.
