<b>1. MEETING MINUTES</b>	Duvall motioned to accept the minutes for 02/8/2202. Hallinin seconded. Motion carried.

### 2. a. **An Ordinance Levying Assessments For Cutting Of Weeds And The Abatement of Nuisances On Certain City Lots.**

Hallinin stated this is done every year for cleanup of properties that have weeds.
Duvall motioned to forward the ordinance to the April 5, 2022, Council meeting with a recommendation for passage. Hallinin seconded. Roll Call. (2 Yeas - 0 Nays). Motion carried.

### b. **A Resolution To Submit To The Electors Of The City Of Circleville The Question Of Whether The Terms Of Office Of Member Of The Legislative Authority Should Be Changed From Two Years To Four Years And Whether The Legislative Authority Should Be Authorized To Establish Staggered Four Year Terms Of Office Among Its Member By Fixing The Term Office Of The Four Ward Council Members At Two Years For One Term Commencing January 1,2024, Then At Four Years Thereafter Pursuant To Section 731.03 Of The Ohio Revised Code.**

<p>Brady explained, this is in the charter, but if the charter does not get voted in, then this is an opportunity to establish the staggered terms for the four Wards and At Large Council members. This will help newly elected Council members.</p> <p>Hallinin stated that Council President would be included with the At Large election's terms.</p> <p>Keller stated we can hear from the Charter Commission on April 12<sup>th</sup> and then take this to the Board Of Elections by August 10<sup>th</sup>.</p> <p>Hallinin read a statement from Michelle Blanton, asking the Judicial Cmte to wait to hear from the Charter Commission on April 12<sup>th</sup> before passing this ordinance on to a Council meeting. The cmte agreed to that statement.</p>
Duvall motioned to forward the ordinance to the May 17, 2022, Council meeting with a recommendation for passage. Hallinin seconded. Roll Call. (2 Yeas - 0 Nays). Motion carried.
