

CIRCLEVILLE CITY COUNCIL MINUTES 7-6-2021

Circleville City Council convened in City Council Chambers Tuesday July 6, 2021, at 7:00 pm. Roll call, members present: David Crawford, Council President; Michelle Blanton, At Large; Katie Logan Hedges, At Large Tom Klitzka, At Large; Jeff Hallinin, First Ward; Barry Keller, Second Ward; Todd Brady, Third Ward; Sheri Theis, Fourth Ward; and Linda Chancey, Clerk. Invited guests Mayor Don McIlroy and Auditor Mark Bidwell and City Treasurer Dodie Radcliff and Law Director Gary Kenworthy

President Crawford called the meeting to order at 7:12 pm. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited, and invocation was given by all. Brady motioned to approve Council minutes for June 15, 2021, and Public Hearing minutes for May 18, 2021. Klitzka seconded. Motion carried.

REPORTS FROM COUNCIL MEMBERS

Crawford stated that prior to Council Mtg there was a Public Hearing regarding the Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA) for the downtown area. The DORA was forwarded to the Judicial Cmte for further study.

REPORTS FROM CITY OFFICIALS

The mayor reported that Sheetz is donating their change to help families in Pickaway County. They donated \$42,500.00 to Special Olympics and Emergency Clearing House. They are partnering with the city on these organizations. Crawford also commented that they are donating food to the local food pantry.

COMMUNICATIONS

City Treasurer Dodie Radcliff submitted her office's 2nd Annual Quarterly Report, dated July 5, 2021. Hallinin motioned to accept the correspondence and place them file. Brady seconded. Motion carried

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Josh Ford, 1151 North Court Street, UpTown Design Cmte. spoke about the project for the semi closure alleyway next to Shariff's, both property owners are in favor of this project. The Nelsonville brick project to be placed in the intersection of Court and Main Streets is in the design phase. The plan for more parking space behind the BMV is in process.

ORDINANCES FOR SECOND READING

Adopting Of The City Of Circleville, Ohio For The Fiscal Year Beginning January 1, 2022, And Submitting The Same To The County Auditor. Keller stated this was reviewed in the Finance Cmte and was recommended for passage. This is the 2022 City budget, \$58, 919,705.67. Included in the budget is a loan for 30 million for Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) improvements and purchase of a new ladder truck for the Fire Dept. with a grants and bonds.

Keller motioned to suspend the rules. Blanton seconded. Roll call (7 Yeas- 0 Nays). Rules are suspended. Keller motioned for passage. Hallinin seconded. Roll call. (7 Yeas – 0 Nays). Ordinance passes and assigned #07-32-2021.
